

Advisory Board actions and key messages 19th April 2023

This note provides a summary of the key information for sharing and actions for members arising from the 19th April Advisory Board. It is intended as an aide memoire for members and Advisory Board representatives, for onward distribution within your organisations as appropriate.

Federated Data Platform

NHS England is procuring a <u>data platform</u> that will serve local and national data needs and critically will provide frontline health and care staff with insight and intelligence drawn from data to transform services and improve care for people. PRSB is working with NHS England to **engage professionals in the ongoing design and development of the federated data platform** including what resources would help build awareness and understanding of the programme. PRSB would like the professional bodies to take part in a questionnaire to assess current levels of awareness and how knowledge gaps can best be addressed. **Please complete this <u>short questionnaire</u>** by 9am 3rd May.

Information standards and emerging technologies

Experts posit that artificial intelligence has the power to transform health and care safely as long as it is done in coalition with clinicians. The Advisory Board recommend that PRSB work with other organisations in the information space to develop a position statement on artificial intelligence. PRSB's interest is in ensuring the patient information available to health and care professionals is of good quality and is consistently available wherever and however care is administered. New and emerging technologies need to be built on a foundation of good data and we believe information standards are a prerequisite for this. Interoperability commitments in Scotland

Scottish government details its plans regarding information standards and interoperability in its recently published <u>data strategy for health and care</u>. PRSB welcome and aim to support these ambitious plans. Ensuring UK alignment in development and adoption of standards is widely recognised as important by the PRSB membership. Transfers of Care standards adoption review

NHS England commissioned a review on the status of adoption of the e-discharge standard (originally published 2015), focusing on the reasons for slow uptake with a particular focus on the needs of 'receivers' in general practice. The conclusions of this work suggest that the case for promoting widespread use of the PRSB discharge standard remains strong and that finding solutions to common problems would advance all transfers of care and interoperability generally. Transfers of care have been approached piecemeal and as a (purely) technical problem - it must be reframed in terms of continuity of care and good patient outcomes. Collective view from members

There have been two recent publications on progress toward digital transformation and integrated care in the NHS and social care, the Committee Inquiry into the Government commitment to digital transformation in the NHS and the Hewitt Review into the oversight, governance, and accountability of Integrated Care Systems. PRSB has written to the Health and Social Care Select Committee and Expert Panel and will write to Patricia Hewitt. It is important to ensure we have a collective view from members, so we are seen to speak with a powerful, multidisciplinary voice. **Key messages:** Digital transformation isn't about 'getting the tech right', it is about improving the working lives of professionals and outcomes for people. By fully mobilising the professions and people to transform digitally we can improve care and efficiency for professionals, provide more effective care, better outcomes and people who are more engaged in their own health. PRSB has put the basic building blocks in place through our standards work and partnership scheme. PRSB and its members stand ready to help key national programmes to speed implementation of standards and interoperability to achieve digital transformation for the benefit of the professions and public once and for all. **We are asking members to share the key messages by**

writing in support to the <u>Committee</u>, Expert Panel, and <u>Hewitt Review</u> and taking the messages back to your organisations and to meetings with system leaders and DHSC.
